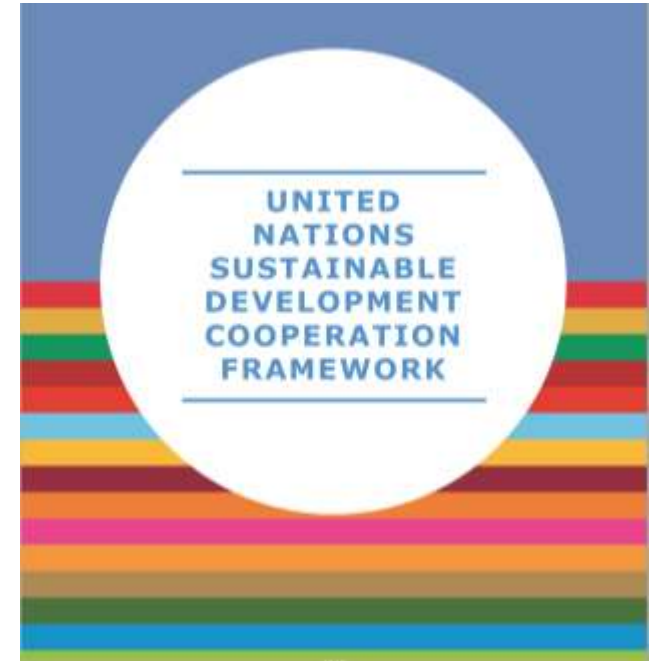

## Migration Governance Snapshot: The Republic of Serbia

### KEY FINDINGS

#### DOMAIN 5: MOBILITY DIMENSIONS OF CRISES

Migration Governance: examples of well-developed areas:

- Humanitarian assistance is provided regardless of migration status, and is coordinated by the Commissariat for Refugees and Migration.
- Authorities use several types of communication systems to spread information on the evolving nature of crises, including channels to reach immigrants.
- A response plan was adopted in 2015 to be able to effectively respond to rapid increases in the number of migrants and asylum-seekers entering Serbia. The plan is regularly updated according to need.

Areas with potential for further development:

- There is currently no comprehensive policy or legislative framework that addresses environmental degradation and the adverse effects of climate change.
- The National Strategy for Protection and Rescue in Emergency Situation, adopted in 2011, does not include specific provisions for addressing the displacement impacts of disasters.

**Mobility dimensions of crises**

This domain studies the type and level of preparedness of countries when they are faced with mobility dimensions of crises, linked to either disasters, the environment and/or conflict. The questions are used to identify the processes in place for nationals and non-nationals both during and after disasters, including whether humanitarian assistance is equally available to migrants as it is to citizens.

# Key findings in Tajikistan

## Well-developed areas

Access to health/education services

Well set up structure on migration management

Availability of information on migration rules and regulations

Publication of migration data and labour market reports

Participation on various national/regional dialogues: Progue, Almaty/MoUs

Availability of measure to manage large scale movement in crises

## Potential for further development

Outdated concept on migration and long delay with the Law on Migration

No policy or strategy to combat hate crimes, violence, xenophobia or discrimination against migrants

Only permanent residents and refugees have equal access to employment

No strategy on addressing migratory movement due to climate change

No policy/strategy to ensure that migrant detention is used only as a measure

All migrants are considered under a single type visa regardless of the work or specific labour skills
