



# United Nations Regional Network on Migration for Latin America and the Caribbean Work Plan 2023-2024

Priorities for the 2023-2024 period

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May 2023

## Introduction

The United Nations Regional Network on Migration for Latin America and the Caribbean (from here on, “the Regional Network”) has been established in order to guarantee effective, timely and coordinated support from the entire system to the region’s Member States in the implementation, follow-up and review of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (from here on, “Global Compact”).

This biennial Work Plan for the Regional Network encompasses the 2023 and 2024 period, in view of the Second Regional Review of the Global Compact<sup>1</sup>. The Plan represents the commitment of the members of the Regional Network<sup>2</sup> to ensure effective and coherent support in the implementation, follow-up and review of the Global Compact.

The priorities identified in this 2023-2024 regional work plan are based on an exhaustive review and analysis of several findings, recommendations and deliberations emanating from the [Report on the first regional review of the implementation of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration in Latin America and the Caribbean](#)<sup>3</sup>, [the 2022 biannual Report of the Secretary-General](#), [the Official Summary of the International Migration Review Forum \(IMRF\), its Declaration of Progress](#) and [the commitments contracted by the Member States, the United Nations system, Civil Society and other interested parties](#), as well as [the United Nations Network on Migration Workplan 2022-2024](#).

The priorities identified by the Regional Conference on Migration (RCM)<sup>4</sup>, by the South American Conference on Migration (SACM)<sup>5</sup> and by other regional processes have also provided key inputs for this work plan.

## Priorities

Based on the analysis of the mentioned reports and declarations, the Work Plan 2023-24 defines a set of **basic priorities** and **thematic priorities** for the Regional Network, reflecting the most pressing needs and opportunities identified in Latin America and the Caribbean to date. These

two groups of priorities guide the Regional Network's efforts towards the second Regional Review set for the first semester of 2024.

## Basic Priorities

The Work Plan 2023-24 is based on the following **four basic priorities**. Each priority is broken down into a series of activities that aim to facilitate obtaining results.

1. Ensure **effective, timely and coordinated support from the whole United Nations System to the Member States** in the implementation, follow-up, and review of the Global Compact at regional level in coordination with the Global Network, the Secretariat and the Network's Executive Committee;
2. Strengthen **technical support for national networks** on migration;
3. Guarantee the Global Compact's **whole-of-society approach** by promoting the significant participation of civil society and other relevant stakeholders, particularly the **Latin America and the Caribbean Civil Society Permanent Dialogue Mechanism**;
4. Encourage the adoption of **one common voice in the Regional Network** regarding the Global Compact.

## Thematic Priorities

The Regional Network's Work Plan outlines **three thematic priorities**. Each priority includes a series of activities that aim to channel the Network's labour and reach concrete results before the celebration of the Second Regional Review of the Global Compact in Latin America and the Caribbean:

1. **Save lives and establish coordinated international efforts on missing migrants.**
  - Compact objectives: 1, 8, 23
2. Promote a higher **social inclusion** of migrants through the increase of **pathways for regular migration** (labour, family, humanitarian, among others) and **regularization of migration**, the recognition of their **contributions to sustainable development** and the **combat against discrimination and xenophobia**.
  - Compact objectives: 5, 6, 9, 10, 16, 17, 19, 22, 23
3. Guarantee an effective **return and readmission** in safe and dignified conditions, as well as the **sustainable reintegration** of migrants in their host communities.
  - Compact objectives: 7, 15, 16, 21, 23.

## Monitoring and accountability

The Regional Network's Work Plan establishes that the co-chairs will oversee the regular review of the work plan's implementation; they will follow-up with the agencies responsible for the activities and adjust their approach when faced with new contextual opportunities and necessities, in line with global frameworks. Furthermore, the co-chairs will provide periodic updates regarding the progress made.
