

Migrant Rights Pop-Up Event

The <u>Migrant Rights Initiative</u>, based at Cornell University, has the honor of inviting you to a Migrant Rights Pop-Up Event to mark the official launch of the <u>Migrant Rights Database</u>.

The event will take place from 10:30 - 12:30 (with presentations at 10:30 and 11:30) on Tuesday 7 March 2023 in Room XXVII at the Palais des Nations.

The Migrant Rights Initiative's MRD is a rigorous empirical account of laws protecting the human rights of all migrants and the cross-national implementation that helps them flourish. The Database is the <u>first</u> global data source benchmarking the extent to which States fulfill their international obligations to protect the rights of all migrants in national law as well as how they implement them. It currently features data from 36 countries worldwide accounting for nearly 70 percent of the world's migrant stock and will soon be expanded to include 45 country cases.

This Migrant Rights Pop-Up Event will feature an introduction by the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Human Rights of Migrants, Professor Felipe Gonzáles Morales (by video) and a demonstration by Professor Ian M. Kysel, Cornell University, and Professor Justin Gest, George Mason University and remarks by Dr. Koko Warner, Director of the Global Data Institute, International Organization for Migration. Presentations will take place at 10:30 and 11:30.
