Europe

- The European Alternatives to Detention
 Network (EATDN) promotes community-based alternatives to enforcement-based migration management systems
- Network members in seven European countries are working to find durable solutions for migrants while living in the community

Central America

- A project from SOS Children's Villages and IMUMI provided information and protection for children and adolescents in situations of irregular migration
- A community-based model for for comprehensive care could include children being fostered temporarily by families
