## Talking Points January 2024

All Member States, Network members and stakeholders are kindly requested to promote Hub content and encourage engagement with the Hub in their ongoing outreach – including at events, meetings, and on social media (#MigrationWeek). Herewith are suggested **talking points** that could be integrated into GCM related interventions, trainings or events.

## Suggested talking points

- The Migration Network Hub is the mandated platform of the United Nations Network on Migration for knowledge exchange on the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly, and Regular Migration (GCM). It is a key resource for Member States and partners to implement this cooperative framework.
- Interactive and multilingual, it mirrors progress on GCM implementation and promotes inclusivity and interaction among the global, regional, national and local levels.
- Each month, around 16,000 people seek out or submit content on or to the Hub.
- Through engaging with the Hub, Member States, Network members and other stakeholders can learn from others, and contribute their experiences to support more effective and impactful GCM implementation elsewhere.
- The Hub is located on the **UN Migration Network website**, and available in English, French, and Spanish. The Hub contains and accepts content submitted in all UN lanaguages.
- Flagship Hub features include: searchable **Repository of practices**<sup>1</sup> and **Library** with tools, literature and multimedia curated by GCM objective and guiding principle; dedicated capacity-building tools developed by the Network, including a **Demand-driven facility** and Guidance offering tailor-made trainings; and interactive exchanges through online **Discussion spaces**, allowing consultations and events to reach and receive inputs from wider audiences.
- The Hub launched the **CLIMB Policy Database** (Oct 2023), which is an interactive tool to access and learn about policies relevant to human mobility, climate change, sustainable development, disaster and environmental degradation around the world.
  - Prepared by the Network Workstream on climate change, the Database is an excellent example of the practical contributions a Network workstream can make to support GCM implementation.
- Member States, Network members and stakeholders are strongly encouraged to engage with the Hub, submit practices and to organize or participate in online discussions for a richer community of GCM implementation.

1. Practices can be submitted any time on any topic, with thematic "calls for practices" occurring in parallel. All practices are endorsed by at least two Hub migration expert "peer reviewers", who ensure the relevance of the practice to the GCM, in order to be published online.
